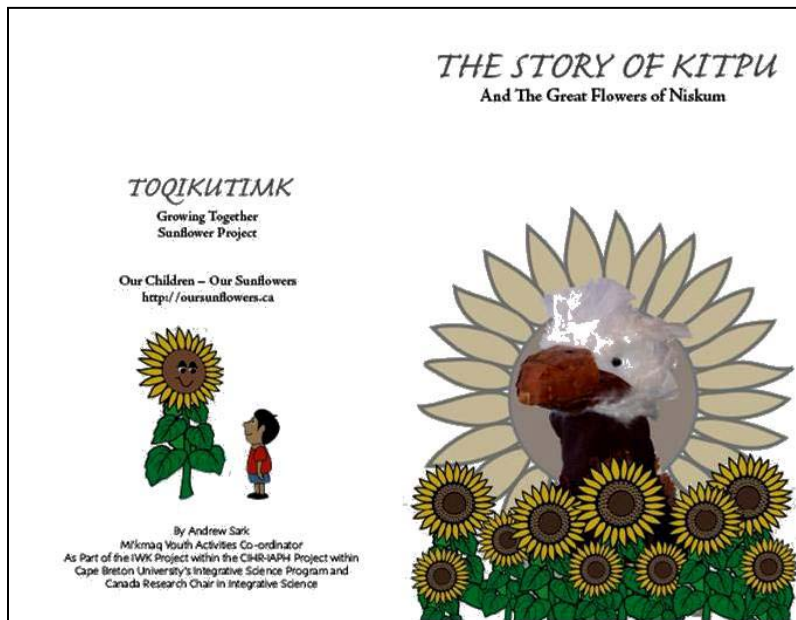


THE STORY OF KITPU AND THE GREAT FLOWERS OF NISKUM
